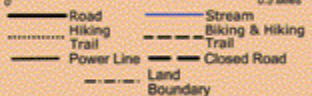
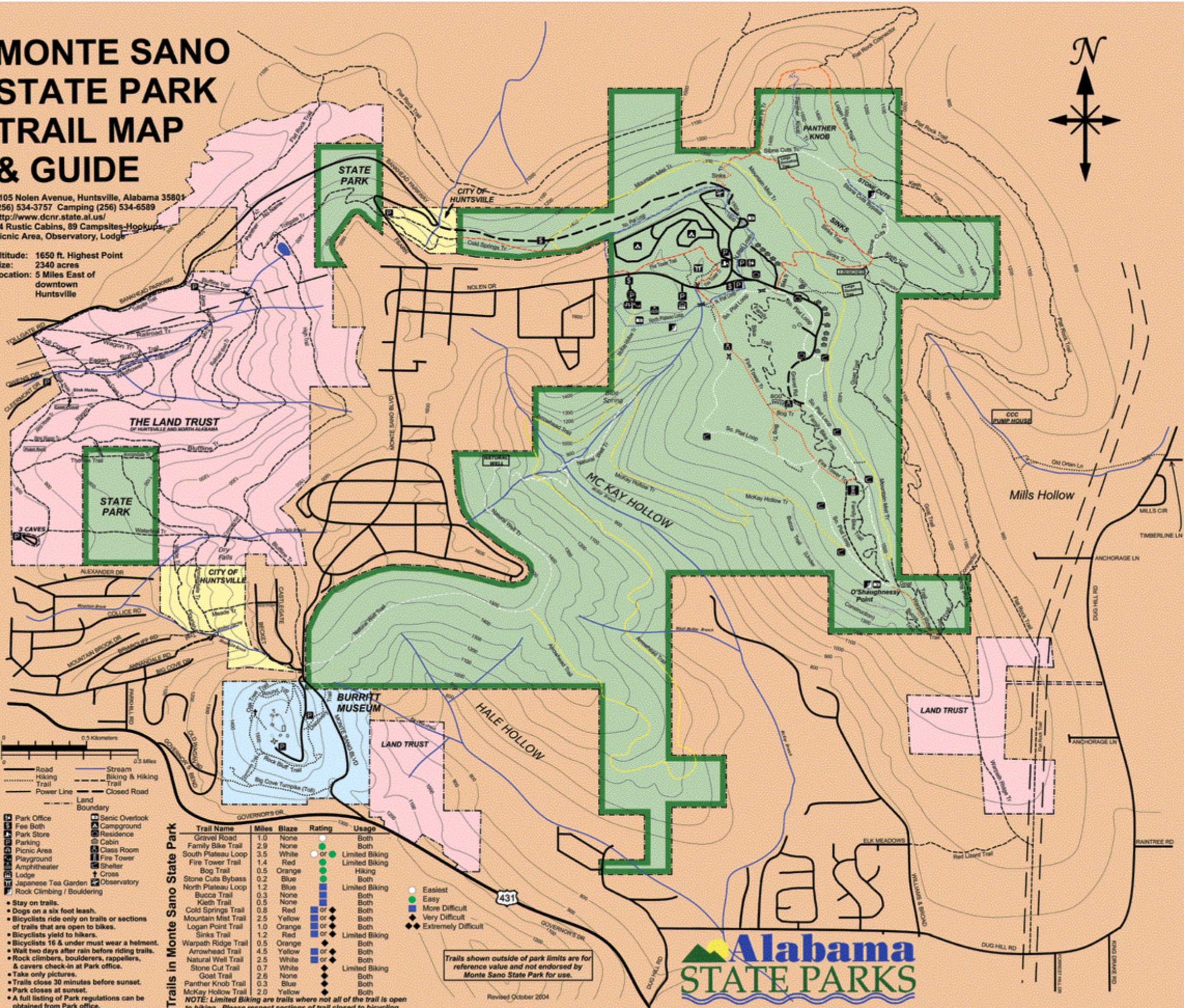

- Dogs on a six foot leash.
- Bicyclists ride only on trails or sections of trails that are open to bikes.
- Bicyclists yield to hikers.
- Bicyclists 16 & under must wear a helmet.
- Wait two days after rain before riding trails.
- Rock climbers, boulderers, rappellers, & cavers check-in at Park office.
- Take only pictures.
- Trails close 30 minutes before sunset.
- Park closes at sunset.
- A full listing of Park regulations can be obtained from Park office.
